With the warm weather early this spring visitors flocked to Wembury to take in the scenery and sunshine on the beach, to walk the South West Coast Path, and those slightly braver have already taken to the water, without wetsuits!

Local walling contractor Maxine McAdams has featured in a few of our previous newsletters but with the final section of walling completed I wanted to take this last opportunity to thank her for all the amazing work. Wembury entrance has been transformed and is now a much more welcoming arrival to Wembury Beach.

At this time of year when the vegetation really starts to grow the rangers start work across the property car parks to ensure good presentation and a welcoming entrance to our sites. All the property footpaths will now start to have all encroaching plants trimmed back, litter removed and drainage gullies cleared out.

We have had numerous complaints from walkers regarding cyclists on the Warren and Netton Cliffs at Noss Mayo. The policy of the National Trust is the same as the local authority and that is that no cycling should be undertaken on any public footpath regardless of the time of day or number of walkers on site. We understand that some paths are more accommodating for both pedestrians and cyclists, however if it is classed as a footpath then cycling is not permitted. People are free to cycle on bridleways and restricted byways.
