You will have seen that railings have been installed opposite the wooden hut at the entrance to Wembury beach car park. This is due to the supporting wall collapsing and work to repair this will be commencing shortly. We hope to have all the works completed before the Summer holidays. The pay & display machines at Wembury beach will be installed later in the year and the car park will be staffed daily from the 25<sup>th</sup> March.

We have another guided walk (linking with the RAMM Webcam exhibition) with Ranger Lorna Sherriff on the 8<sup>th</sup> April. Starting from Wembury Beach you can experience a guided walk from the beach to Wembury Point from 11am until 1pm. It is a chance to admire the same views and wildlife that have been displayed in Exeter's Royal Albert Memorial Museum webcam exhibition.

We are also running a volunteering day to join the Rangers ragwort pulling and repairing footpaths at Wembury Point on the 1<sup>st</sup> May from 10am-3pm.
